

# Doctor Europaeus

The Doctor Europaeus certification is an additional certification to the PhD title that is issued nationally. It is not an academic title with supranational value, nor a title conferred by international institutions.

The conditions for requesting the Doctor Europaeus certificate are:

1. Two positive assessments of the thesis by two reviewers belonging to two universities in two European countries other than the one where the thesis will be discussed.
2. At least one member of the final examination commission must belong to a university in a European country other than the one where the thesis will be discussed.
3. Discussion of the thesis in one of the official languages of the European Union, different from that of the country where the thesis is being discussed.
4. Research stay of at least 3 months, even if not consecutive, in a European country other than that of the student.

To activate the procedure for obtaining the title of Doctor Europaeus, the tutor of the doctoral student must apply for approval to the Teaching Body, which undertakes to endorse compliance with the above conditions.

In the event of a positive decision, doctoral students must make an express request to the University, when applying for admission to the final exam (or in any case before the final exam), attaching the approval of the Teaching Body to the request.
